Luke Fedler brings more than two decades of dedicated public service, leadership, and community partnership to his new role as Executive Director of Habitat for Humanity of the San Juans. With over 25 years of experience serving the people of Delta and the surrounding region, Luke has built a career rooted in integrity, collaboration, and a deep commitment to strengthening the communities of Western Colorado.

Prior to joining Habitat for Humanity of the San Juans, Luke served in law enforcement for over 25 years, including ten years with the Delta County Sheriff's Office and extensive service with the Delta Police Department. In 2017, he was appointed Chief of Police of the Delta Police Department where he led a department of 23 sworn officers and 10 civilian support staff. Throughout his career, Luke distinguished himself through his collaborative leadership style, his ability to build trust across diverse groups, and his dedication to empowering teams to serve the public with professionalism and compassion.

Luke's background includes broad experience in strategic planning, operational management, training, and community outreach—skills that translate directly into Habitat's mission of building safe, affordable homes in partnership with local families. His service experience spans roles as patrol officer, detective, detective sergeant, instructor, and ultimately Chief of Police, giving him a deep understanding of the social, economic, and housing challenges that impact community well-being.

Luke earned his Colorado Basic Peace Officer Certification from the Delta-Montrose Area Vocational Technical Center in 2000. As a committed lifelong learner, he later earned a Bachelor of Science in Public Management from Colorado State University, graduating with academic honors. He has completed extensive specialized training across the Western United States in leadership, investigations, organizational development, and community engagement.

Beyond his professional roles, Luke is deeply invested in community service. He served on the 7th Judicial Community Corrections Board, is an active member of the Delta Elks Lodge, and contributed to the next generation of public servants as an instructor and advisory board member for the Technical College of the Rockies Law Enforcement Academy. He is also the past president of the Western Colorado Peace Officers Association, where he helped strengthen collaboration among agencies across the region.

Luke and his wife Angela have two children and two beautiful grandchildren. The entire family lives and works in the area of Montrose and Delta. Luke and his family will soon be moving to Montrose County, to the Pea Green area where they are currently building their forever home.
